

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



8 HARBORD SQUARE (G7)

Massive congratulations to the G7 team for winning the NHBC Pride in the Job Quality award. This is in addition to being recognised for outstanding brick architecture by being nominated for the BDA Brick Awards.

7 AND 13 BRANNAN STREET (F1 & F2)

Following adverse ground conditions in the spring requiring extra work to complete the piling, the enabling works at 7 and 13 Brannan Street (Buildings F1 and F2) are now complete.

After the dewatering and reclaiming of a small dock area the secant pile wall basement structure at 7 Brannan Street is over halfway towards completion, meaning we are still on track to reach our target completion of October 2023.

The building piles for 13 Brannan Street are due to commence in September, one month earlier than originally anticipated, with the team working hard to achieve this target.

40 & 50-60 CHARTER STREET (E3E4 & J1J3)

The superstructure is progressing well with the target being to meet our key milestone of topping out of J1 ahead of schedule in October 2023. The cladding installation is also progressing well with the internal fitting out following on behind.


3 & 15 WEST LANE (G1 & G5)


The brickwork is progressing behind the protection and will be unveiled in the new year.

ONE CARTIER CIRCLE (B2)

We have 20 units per floor making up 16 apartments and there are over 50 bolted connections per floor to transfer the load back into the concrete cores. We recently landed our 300th module by contractor M-AR Off Site Construction. Topping out of the modules is due in September. The steel contractor will then complete the final two floors (Level 19 and 20). Level 19 will be an open plan restaurant which provides great 360 degrees views of the O2 arena and the iconic One Canada Square.







NON ROAD MOBILE MACHINERY (NRMM)

In June, Wood Wharf underwent an audit from the Greater London Authority (GLA). This audit was to check the compliance of the non-mobile machinery (NRMM) which is used to aid the construction works. NRMM vehicles are those which are:

- Not intended for carrying passengers or goods on the road.
- Installed with a combustion engine either an internal spark ignition petrol engine, or a compression ignition diesel engine.

Examples of non-road mobile machinery you may have seen on or around our site include but are not limited to:

- Generators
- Bulldozers
- Forklifts
- Mobile cranes

We are pleased to announce that the GLA found our machinery deployed on site compliant with the air quality emissions requirements for the London area.

GROUNDWATER MONITORING

The Wood Wharf development is surrounded by water as seen in the docks but also under the site in the form of groundwater. Groundwater is important to the environment because it provides a source of freshwater and helps to stabilise the ground.

In June the Wood Wharf development underwent a site inspection with the Environment Agency (EA) to check that the groundwater monitoring regime is adequate and the groundwater resources are being managed in the most sustainable way. During the inspection the Engineer checked:

- Condition of the site where the groundwater is pumped and discharged.
- Meters associated with the abstraction (taking water from the ground) are properly installed and recording flow volumes.

The inspection found that we are compliant against our licence which permits us to abstract water.



CONSTRUCTION YOUTH TRUST

At the end of June Canary Wharf Contractors (CWC) collaborated with the Construction Youth Trust (CYT) to deliver a week-long World-of-Work programme. 19 local students from Tower Hamlets participated in a replication of real-life experience of working in construction and the built environment to improve their collaborative skills, task prioritisation and achieving targets individually and as a team to meet their clients' needs.

As part of the programme CWC hosted a site visit to Wood Wharf for the students to experience a live construction site, in addition to providing 1-2-1 mentoring to the students throughout the week and constructive feedback to the students' presentations.



CAREER INSIGHT DAYS

As part of Canary Wharf Group's (CWG) ongoing commitment to promote the built environment and reducing the industry wide skills gap, we invited Bow School Year 10 to career insight days held at the North Quay and Wood Wharf development sites on the 12th and 13th July.

The sessions hosted 39 students who were given a presentation highlighting various careers and job roles within the industry. This was followed by a short quiz, a site tour, professional career talks and an interactive Lego building competition. The Lego building competition embedded the functions of finances, design, engineering, sustainability, marketing and identifying the importance of teamwork, time management and following the clients brief whilst maintaining the enjoyable element of the game.
